Overall Considerations

- For now, based on funding: 2 larger, 5 smaller (kiosks, wayfinding signs

 – the
 terminology is interchangeable for now). Style/content should be able to be
 replicated/adapted to additional sites. May have additional signage attached to street
 signs, pedestrian oriented, within the forest, at either end of Village/Town with distance
- 2. Larger kiosks will have room for photos, more place history, ecology, etc.
- 3. See <u>Timberhomes</u> for kiosk style ideas
- 4. Consider signs north (Northfield Falls) and south (Mobil/64) directing to amenities.
- 5. Action Item: discuss the orientation (N, E) of primary wayfinding map
- 6. A "ski trail map" Is an example of a viewer-oriented map with North on the left.
- Town Forest itself needs better internal wayfinding (legible/organized blaze system); distance to specific locations
- 8. Review VAST trails for connectivity

Locations Visited

- 1. Town Common
 - Bus shelter location not obvious to the west of the common, with no crossing, but has area info posted in the shelter
 - Tree/hydrant Area at northeast corner likely spot for wayfinding sign (trim broken branch)
 - "Sign" can be a form of art, permanent or rotating, locally-designed, but with consistent wayfinding information.
 - Sign could be table-top info style
 - Try a temporary sign installation to determine locations, type
 - Stay off of the main green area (farmers market, etc.)
- 2. Library
 - Location for 1 of the 2 larger kiosks, with photos and more info (trails, pond)
 On Slate, at side of library along sidewalk
 - Onsite parking for library only

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- Road-sign "add-on" at corner of Slate and Main for Town Forest (like Dog River Park, Pool, Memorial Park)
- Distance to Town Forest
- 3. Top of Slate Avenue (Town Forest Access)
 - Norwich ownership of entrance area
 - Directional signage before gate, more information after gate at bench landing
 - Parking information/organization needed
- 4. Byam Hill (Town Forest Access)
 - No parking up top, residents don't want turnarounds in driveways either
 - Need a sign at bottom of the hill (junction with Highland) to note lack of parking and turnaround at top of hill; with directions to where parking is available
 - Kiosk would be placed further up the access road when reach Town Forest along with replacing the gate
 - Smaller sign at lower gate
- 5. Green Mountain Family Practice (Town Forest Access)
 - 4 designated parking spaces available for Town Forest at south end of lot (to the right when driving in)
 - Trail access up to town forest at the northeast corner of the building is not obvious
 - Sign at Crescent directing to trails and parking? Coordinate with crossings.
 - Future sidewalk continuation from GMF up to Shaw Center
- 6. Shaw Center (Town Forest Access)
 - Norwich may redo building; private/public use may change
 - Trail access at rear of site, behind building.
 - Also access road to south of building
 - 2 of 2 larger kiosk could go near trash can at north side of building
 - Sign at Crescent and Main directing to trails and parking? Coordinate with crossings.
 - Small signs at trail heads?
- 7. Barrows/Kingston Roads (Town Forest Access)
 - Vehicle access difficult, but hiking entry to forest is relatively flat (compared with other Town Forest entrances)
 - The trail locations are unclear in this portion of the forest
